



What Does It Mean to Take CTE Courses in Middle School?

Middle school CTE courses ensure all students in grades 6-8 have the unique opportunity to explore careers.

Utilizing their middle school years to explore and curate their interests assist students in building a strong foundation of becoming career, college, and life ready. Middle school is the perfect time to provide students with pertinent information about future careers and introductory skills they will need to embark upon the ever-changing workforce.

Computer Applications - quarter or semester, grade 6

This course is designed to assist students in applying a variety of computer technology and its application to their daily lives. In addition to information literacy, the areas of technology introduced may include word processing, spreadsheet, database, Internet, e-communication, graphics, presentations, and publications applications.






Applied Technology – semester, grades 7 and 8

This course introduces students to the use of emerging technologies and applications, such as Lego Robotics, to prepare them for current workplace practices and everyday life. Combining colorful LEGO building elements, easy-to-use hardware, and an intuitive drag-and-drop coding language based on Scratch, SPIKE Prime continuously engages students through playful learning activities to think critically and solve complex problems, regardless of their learning level. From easy-entry projects to limitless creative design possibilities, including the option to explore text-based coding with Python, SPIKE Prime helps students learn the essential STEAM and 21st century skills needed to become the innovative minds of tomorrow... while having fun!







Graphic Communications - semester, grades 7 and 8

This course introduces students to basic design elements by manipulating digital images and completing graphic design and desktop publishing projects such as photo editing, graphic, raster and vector projects, text effects, business cards, posters, brochures, and covers. Students use Adobe Photoshop, InDesign and Illustrator to create digital projects.



Introduction to Programming – semester, grades 7 and 8

This course is designed for students to explore programming concepts, use algorithmic procedures, implement programming procedures with one or more standard languages, such as JavaScript, Python and C++, as well as master programming fundamentals. Coding is used throughout the course. Graphical user interfaces are used as students design and develop applications.



Video Production - semester, grades 7 and 8

This course is designed to provide students with exploratory and investigative activities dealing with camera functions, filming techniques, composition, non-linear/linear editing using Adobe Premiere Pro. This class will ask students to express themselves through researching, writing, and creating media projects. Students will consistently use critical thinking skills and a good work ethic to achieve an advanced level of media literacy.

Script writing and public speaking is a vital component to the class.



Sixth grade students are placed on a career exploratory wheel with classes lasting for nine weeks while 7th and 8th grade students are given more time to dive deeper in specific course material resulting in longer periods of instruction such as semester. Each CTE middle school course incorporates career ready practices such as teamwork, collaboration, and communication skills to assist them not only in CTE courses but throughout all courses. By offering a wide variety of CTE courses, middle school students create their own career exploration journey.

SHAPE Fitness Centre Main Building Closure

From Saturday, 09 March until Friday, 22 March, the Main Building of the SHAPE Fitness Centre will be closed for Exercise STEADFAST BLUEPRINT 24, which is a SHAPE-led Deterrence and Defence of the Euro-Atlantic Area (DDA) Rehearsal of Concept Drill. The purpose of the exercise is to rehearse the DDA Family of Plans to ensure theatre-wide understanding and validate the execution of NATO's defense plans

To support this significant NATO Exercise, the squash courts, spinning suite, aerobic suite, weights, CV room, changing room, all offices, and swimming pool will not be available. The swimming pool, saunas, changing rooms, squash courts, weights and cardio room will reopen Saturday, 23 March. All remaining Sports and Fitness areas will reopen Monday, 25 March.

The climbing wall will be closed 19 and 20 February. The main court area will be subject to closure from Monday, 26 February.

The Gymnasium Annex will remain open throughout with 24/7 access. Customers who are not already registered for 24/7 access are encouraged to do so as soon as possible.

The gym (including classes) at Chievres Air Force (CAB) Base will remain available to all SHAPE ID (AMIS) Card holders during normal opening hours: Mon-Fri – 0600-1900, Sat-Sun – 0900-1700. 24/7 access to the Chievres Gym is NOT available to SHAPE ID holders.
